Disk drives don't last forever, and they don't have a signal to let you know when they'll die, they just do (lasting an average of 5 years). Don't get caught short by a crash. It's a good idea to back up at least monthly.

- While these sites are free, the records require a checkbook or credit card for payment.
- Instead of finding the links on the internet, you can use <u>Vital Records Handbook</u> which is on the WVGC library cart-just remember to sign it out (and back in). For other countries, try "death certificates" and "country of your choice.
