

October 15: Beginning Your Genealogy Journey-Are you wanting to begin your family history, but don't know how? Or have you started and let it slide? George Nettleton will give some guidelines and a process for beginning your genealogy. If you're a more experienced genealogists, you're to come for reinforcing some of the points, or maybe to be reminded of steps you may have become lax with.

September: *Spotlight*: Pat Burkhart gave us a review of a new magazine in our library: <u>DNA & Your Genealogy</u> by Dr. Maurice Gleeson, which describes almost everything you need to know for using DNA as a tool in your family tree research. Entire chapters are devoted to: the basic science of DNA, types of DNA, DNA, and adoption. It also includes many helpful charts, a list of the companies offering testing, which types of DNA are tested, the cost, and the size of their databases. It's a great prep read for our January & February DNA programs.

You might like to use them to find out what your DNA may say about your health.

GRAMPS 5.1.1 is s free genealogy program for setting up your family tree. This is a recent update release and can be downloaded <u>here</u>. It is Windows, Mac & Linux compatible, GEDCOM compatible, has various reports, and helps to keep track of your family genealogy. You might want to download and play with it. As a free program, you have nothing to lose but the time to learn it.
