1-Your full name and when and where you were born 2-Names of your siblings and when & where they were born 3-Your parents' names, when and where they were born and what type of work did they did [now the things you may not already have in your genealogy] what were they like their hobbies memories about them 4-ditto for your grand and great grandparents, uncles and aunts if you knew them 5-How your parents met 6-Your childhood: favorite games books you liked your hobbies, sports, music and activities where you went to school favorite subjects and teachers what you wanted to be when you grew up chores you did trouble you got into your best friends 7-Your high school years subjects you excelled in/struggled with sports, activities (music, clubs, offices held, etc.) friends, dates, dances, etc. learning to drive how you got along with your parents 8-College years, job training and/or transition into work life 9-Military experience (if any) 10-Adult relationships, how you met your spouse 11-Where you settled and your job as a young adult friends

work

12-Being a parent (if you were)

when and where your children were born-their names (& how you chose their names) what you loved and didn't love about having children

13-Life lessons you've learned and advice you'd like to share

14-family stories passed down

15-medical troubles
