Steve was born in Bari, Italy, in 1874 and first came to America in 1900 to search for his ther Christopher ("Zeke"). After locating him in Ohio, the brothers came to Pocahontas, inia. Steve returned briefly to Italy and married Maria Gargaro. Although Maria was recting their first child, Steve returned to Pocahontas alone, to be joined two years later by aria and their son, Antonio ("Tony"), and Steve's mother Anna.

Steve first worked as a blacksmith for the Norfolk and Western Railroad. Later, he A the railroad and opened an Italian restaurant and grocery. After losing his business during the eat Depression, Steve worked as the head of the machine shop for the Pocahontas Fuel mpany.

Steve and Maria had 13 children, including two sets of twins who died at birth or shortly r. Maria died shortly after the birth of their youngest child, Nick. Nine of the children, six and three girls, lived to adulthood. Five of the boys served in the military service during Second World War.

The funny lookin' guy with the saddle shoes and tie is yours truly, in my 2<sup>nd</sup> grade class from Halstead Avenue School, Harrison, NY, which I attended from K-3<sup>rd</sup> grade. but what's that thing over my left eye?

A short time before this picture was taken, some family friends visited with us. As they were leaving and chatting on the front steps, I was putting a golf ball around the front yard with an old golf club, bestowed on me by my Uncle Albert. One of the boys in the family asked if he could try. He then took a swing. Unbeknownst to him I was coming to take it, when he drew the club back, and struck me just over the eye! My parents drove me right to the doctor for three stitches and that bandage. Another quarter inch, the doctor said, and it would have taken my eye! God certainly was watching over me.

Over time, that scar has healed so well, that there's no visual marking, so I've long wondered which eye was struck. This photo answered that. But another question remained: Who was it who hit me? As a genealogist and nostalgist, I'm interested in finding people, including friends from "the good old" days. In 2013, while searching for one of my Harrison friends, Richard Woehr, I ran across his brother Robert. When I contacted him about Richard, he responded "So, how's your eye?" Whaaat? .... it was he who had borrowed the club that day! Mystery solved! In case you're wondering: I have no hard feelings; it was an accident. I was just curious as to who it was....
